1. Alternative 41SO-2

Alternative 41SO-2 (Institutional Controls) is the selected remedy for the soil at Site 41. The description of this alternative states that institutional controls would be used to limit access and control future use of the site. Based on the site descriptions, it is not clear how much real access control there will be for site 41. There does not appear to be any type of fence around the site and the proximity of the site to U.S. Highway 17 makes this a real concern. Please indicate what physical barriers are to be used to limit personnel and vehicular access to Site 41.
